

Reminder on RSA Requirements in Victoria

The Liquor Control Reform Act 1998 (section 11 clause 2) requires that anyone in control of the liquor department at any time must complete this course. You therefore need to have more than one person trained to cover all opening hours.

The Code of Conduct Packaged Liquor Licenses (section 7) requires the following:

- The licensee and any other person who has the management or control of licensed premises must within three months of being granted a licence or a grant of a transfer of a licence complete this course
- All staff employed to serve alcohol must undertake this course within three months of their commencement of employment at the licensed premises
- All staff employed prior to the gazettal of the Code of Conduct (November 2005) must undertake this course within 12 months

Those staff who have already completed this certificate in a face to face training session can update their certificate annually on the LLV website, and do not have to attend further training sessions. They are of course welcome to attend if this is preferred.
